

Hope you enjoy the shows!

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
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














DIRECTOR'S NOTES

After the untimely death of Elvis Presley on the 16th August 1977 at the young age of 42, the President of the USA, Jimmy Carter, released an official statement:

"Elvis Presley's death deprives our country of a part of itself. He was unique and irreplaceable.
